

The people

- 2016 Population is 158,755
- 16% of the population live in the 30% of the county that is in The Gaeltacht.
- 11% of the population are native speakers
 Mostly rural with 12% living in the largest town [Letterkenny] and 21% in other towns over 1,000 population



Ageing Population



- According to the 2011 population statistics, there were 18,411 individuals over the age of 65 in Donegal.
- Donegal has a higher average of people aged over 75, 5.8% compared to 5% nationally.

 Older people require more care and support as they get older.

• Nationally 4.5% of older people access Long Term Care, in Donegal the percentage is 2.8%.

 More older people are cared for at home in Donegal than in any other part of the Republic of Ireland.

63% of individuals with dementia live in the community.

Number of individuals with dementia


- Donegal has the 5th highest number of individuals with dementia (after Dublin, Cork, Limerick and Galway – all with large cities).
- 2011 estimate was 1,929 individuals with dementia in Donegal
- 2016 estimate is 2,200 individuals in Donegal with dementia.
- Approximately 300 under age of 65
