Key Priorities of the NDS

- Better awareness and understanding of dementia
 - provided through information/awareness sessions to local community
- Timely diagnosis and understanding
 - by supporting and linking with GP's through local care pathways
- Integrated Services, Supports and Care
 - through the delivery of home supports and respite, and assistive technology
- Education and Training of staff, family and carers
- Research and evidence through project evaluation
- Leadership through local projects,
 - links with MDT's, care co-ordinators, key workers





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Model of Care for Older People

- Menu & Choice Fundamentals of Service Provision.
 - Responsive
 - User led/Person-centered/Personalised
 - Named key worker
 - Provided by a competent and skilled workforce
 - Re-enablement
 - Quality focus (value for money & quality of service)
 - Integrated within the wider community supports





Integrate Care Programme for Older People (ICPOP)

- Focus on Older People with Dependencies.
- Identification & Assessment.
- Case Management.
- Re-Design services to meet identified needs.

Raising awareness is key to ensuring that the local community is both informed and actively engaged i.e. a dementia friendly and dementia supportive community.
